

North Korea



JULY 2018

Sun 1 – WEEKLY SUMMARY: Little is known about North Korea due to strict regulations on public distribution of information. These restrictions have resulted in the complete isolation of the North Korean people from the rest of the world. There is a great amount of risk involved for anyone who attempts to acquire information that is not approved by the government. Any such violation will lead to severe punishment or imprisonment. Join us in prayer this week for the people of North Korea and FEBC Korea's attempts to reach this country with the gospel message.

Mon 2 – A refugee from North Korea, who escaped to South Korea in 1999, expressed his gratitude towards FEBC: "I am so grateful to FEBC for sending the gospel message to my home country. Thank you!" Pray that many more will hear the Good News.

Tue 3 – Land was recently gifted to FEBC in South Korea, where a powerful new station will soon be built. The broadcasts will be heard across the entire country of North Ko-

rea. Pray that the Lord will provide the funds to build this station.

Wed 4 – Recently a group of North Korean defectors shared their painful testimonies with the staff from FEBC: "We starve, but it's not food we want. We thirst, but not for water. We are sick and have no medicine. We know that only the gospel can heal the people of North Korea." Pray that all the people of North Korea will be reached.

Thu 5 – Due to the current state of affairs in North Korea, many forget that in 1907 there was a great Christian revival in Pyongyang. By the 1940's, despite persecution from Japan, the country had approx. 3,000 churches. Pray for revival to take place once again.

Fri 6 – After the establishment of the new regime under the leadership of Kim II Sung in 1948, an ideology referred to as 'Juche' was implemented as a form of "religion". This marked the end of religious freedom. Pray that this will soon change.

Sat 7 – The current leader, Kim Jong Un, continues to carry out the legacy of brutality passed down from his predecessors. He outlawed everything affiliated with Christianity. Punishment for believers include: starvation, torture and death. Please pray for the protection of every believer.

FEBC Japan

Sun 8 – WEEKLY SUMMARY: Religion in Japan is a combination of different beliefs, mainly Shintoism and Buddhism. Un-

like in the West, religion in Japan is rarely preached, nor is it a doctrine. It is more of a moral code and lifestyle, completely indistin-

guishable from Japanese social and cultural values. Shintoism is the belief in “spiritual beings” and the practice of rituals as an act of worship to the “spirits”. Japan has fewer baptised believers than some Muslim countries. Pray with us for the growth of the Church in Japan and for many to accept Christ through hearing FEBC’s broadcasts.

Mon 9 – There are several churches in Japan. Pray that listeners will be encouraged to attend church services to pursue personal spiritual growth and that they will not be ashamed of the gospel of Christ.

Tue 10 – Please pray that the Lord will strengthen and encourage all the FEBC staff members working in Japan. Even though there is religious freedom, evangelical Christianity is not widely accepted among locals.

Wed 11 – 100% of FEBC Japan’s content is Christian. It includes: sermons, Bible studies, counselling programs, worship music and

testimonies. Thank the Lord that, despite public indifference, they choose to broadcast the Truth!

Thu 12 – 11% of the Japanese population questions their very existence and the country is known for having one of the highest suicide rates in the world. The gospel has the power to restore hope. Pray that the broadcasts will reach the ears of those who are broken.

Fri 13 – 13 years ago a church/pastor visitation program was developed. It involves staff members visiting churches and pastors all over Japan to encourage them in their faith. Pray that the Lord will bless this ministry.

Sat 14 – Evangelical Christianity is frowned upon in Japan, presenting many challenges for those actively involved in the ministry. Pray that the Lord will guide, protect and strengthen the Director, Seiji Suzuki, who carries the weight of this ministry.

FEBA India

Sun 15 – WEEKLY SUMMARY: Violence aimed at religious minority groups in India has sharply increased since 2016. Only 2% of the population are Christian – which is still about 25 million people. This violence against Christians is mostly carried out by Hindu extremists focussed on eradicating Christianity, despite a clause in the country’s constitution that guarantees the freedom of religion. Religious intolerance includes: sabotage of homes, churches and villages, forced reconversion, vandalism and mob violence. Join us in prayer this week for FEBA India and every believer in this country.

Mon 16 – Ancient Hindu religious practices are still prevalent in villages across the coun-

try. Pray that FEBA’s broadcasts will reach these people and change their hearts.

Tue 17 – India contributes to 33% of the world’s total number of child brides. That is approximately 103 million children who are wed before they reach the age of 18. Pray that the Lord will enable FEBA India to tackle this problem.

Wed 18 – A listener from India, who teaches children from 33 villages, shares FEBA’s programs with his students. This has resulted in many young people changing their lives for the better. Praise God for FEBA’s impact on the youth.



Fri 20 – With a population of over 1.2 billion people, India is home to the largest number of unreached people in the world. Pray that the Lord will extend FEBA's reach to all of these people who still need to hear the gospel.

Sat 21 – Human trafficking is a serious issue in India. The FEBA team produces weekly programs, creating awareness about the matter. Thanks to

Thu 19 – Due to religious intolerance, many are afraid to practice their faith openly. Pray that the Lord will protect and strengthen each and every listener of FEBA's broadcasts. these programs, many women have prevented their daughters from entering the industry.

FEBC Mongolia

Sun 22 – WEEKLY SUMMARY: Mongolia's vast landscape is home to one of the world's last surviving nomadic cultures. FEBC Mongolia's goal is to increase the Christian population, now only 3%, to 10% by the year 2020. Due to the impact of technological advancements and fast paced environmental changes, nomadic life is becoming harder to sustain, forcing them to revert to larger cities and adapt to urban life. Join us in prayer this week for FEBC Mongolia and their goal to reach more people in the rural areas of Mongolia. encouraged and strengthened. I will continue to focus on the Great Commission and strive towards producing innovative programs that will inspire audiences to follow Jesus Christ." Thank the Lord for passionate FEBC staff!

Mon 23 – Earlier this year a 'Creative Camp' was held for all the urban and rural stations' staff members. Over a period of three days they learnt about innovative programming. Pray that they will continue to be inspired.

Tue 24 – A staff member shares feedback from her experience of the camp; "I feel very

Wed 25 – Six million Mongolians live in the Inner Mongolian region of Northern China. This amounts to double the number of Mongolians living in the country of Mongolia. There is now an opportunity to reach these people who haven't heard the Good News yet. Pray that the Lord will make this possible.

Thu 26 – A listener from Mongolia expressed her gratitude for FEBC's broadcasts: "I love to listen to the radio while I cook. In my family, the radio is like a new piece of furniture. My favourite program is 'Conversations for Women.'" Pray that more women will be inspired by these broadcasts.

Fri 27 – 16 years ago, Mongolia was a country that had no concept of God. Today, through FEBC's 10 existing radio stations, a vast majority of the population are within reach. Praise the Lord for His faithfulness!

Sat 28 – FEBC promotes family values, responsible living and introduces listeners to biblical principles like charity, kindness and grace, which are making a difference in their lives. In a country where the value system is

depleted, pray that the Lord will increase the reach of FEBC's broadcasts.



FEBC Philippines

Sun 29 – WEEKLY SUMMARY: FEBC Philippines currently broadcasts in 29 different languages from 11 stations around the country, seven of which are also heard online. In addition to broadcasting locally, they also operate six international short-wave transmitters that broadcast programs in over 60 languages and dialects to China and Southeast Asia. FEBC's broadcasts have an incredible impact on its listeners in the Philippines, as the staff continues to receive countless testimonies of transformed lives. Join us in prayer for their listeners and staff members to be refreshed and uplifted!

Mon 30 – Recently, 1197 DXFE "The Good News Radio" in Davao City marked their 46th year anniversary. 22 sewing machines were donated to a number of listeners in Marawi, following the recent outbreak of war that displaced thousands. The people there are pre-

dominantly Muslim. Pray that they will accept Jesus Christ.

Tue 31 – The Philippines experiences tropical cyclones and torrential rain storms throughout the year. The effects can be devastating, causing many to lose their homes and lives. Pray that the Lord will assist the FRR (First Response Radio) team to provide all the aid that is needed.

AUGUST 2018

Wed 1 – Pray that the Lord will strengthen Salvador Gabor Jr. in his faith. He recently accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Saviour and has ever since been hungry to know more about Jesus Christ.

Thu 2 – Pastor Emmanuel Aquino is the Station Manager for 1116 DXAS in Zamboanga City, Philippines. He is passionate about the ministry and is moved by compassion to minister to listeners and serve the community. Pray that the Lord will bless him.

Fri 3 – Earlier this year in the province of Albay, in the Bicol Region, the volcano Mount Mayon erupted. Evacuation centres are facing

FEBC Cambodia

Sun 5 – WEEKLY

SUMMARY: Recently, FEBC Cambodia’s team from Voice of Love Radio station travelled to a rural area in Kam-pot Province (South-ern Cambodia), to meet with listeners and follow up with them about what they learnt from the broadcasts. Among the questions the team asked were: have their lives changed since listening to FEBC’s broadcasts? What are their favourite programs? And how can they apply it to their daily lives? Most said that the broadcasts have had a positive impact on their family’s and personal lives, helping them to pursue a good future in Christ. Pray that the Lord will guide these listeners throughout their journey of faith.

Sun 19 – WEEKLY SUMMARY: FEBC Thailand truly values its listeners by maintaining an extensive, consistent and quality follow-up ministry in the form of letters, phone calls, emails, text messages and personal visits to listeners' homes. They also host frequent ral-

lies where listeners and new believers have the opportunity to worship the Lord together and gain new knowledge of the Word of God. Here people are ministered to and taught about salvation. Join us in prayer this week for FEBC Thailand's ministry, team and their listeners.

First Response Radio

Sun 26 – WEEKLY SUMMARY: First Response Radio (FRR), a partner of FEBC International, is a network of radio broadcasters, NGOs and government partners, who produce programs that assist people during natural disasters and conflicts delivering critical information, via radio, to affected communities. Following the initial broadcasting of life-saving information, they subtly shift from relief aid to grief counselling, restoring joy in daily living and practical messages including housing updates and job opportunities. FRR are most active in countries that experience frequent natural disasters such as: Pakistan,



India, Indonesia, Philippines and Nepal. Their ability to respond, within 72 hours of a catastrophe, makes their relief efforts extremely valuable. Please pray for the protec-

tion, wisdom, physical and mental strength of the FRR team members who place their lives at risk.

Mon 27 – The Philippines experiences frequent tropical storms that often lead to excessive flooding, landslides, cyclones, earthquakes and large scale typhoons which are often disastrous. Pray that the Lord will prepare the FRR team in the Philippines.

Tue 28 – According to the latest 'World Risk Report', India is rated as a "middle" to "high" risk zone for natural disasters. Survivors often experience negative socio-psychological affects in the aftermath. Pray that the Lord will intervene during times of disaster.

Wed 29 – Not long ago there was a volcanic eruption on Mt. Agung in Bali. From day one, FRR's broadcasts ensured the safe evacuation of residents in the area. Pray that FRR will continue to be a life-saving voice to that community.

Thu 30 – When FRR was established in 2004, they immediately gained government support, allowing them to continue their work on the front lines of disaster incidents. One of their team leaders recently stated, "God was truly in this." Thank the Lord for his active hand in FRR's work.

Fri 31 – Please pray for the First Response radio teams that are active in several different countries, ready to respond when disaster strikes. May the Lord, not only give them personal strength, but also wisdom to counsel traumatised victims.

SEPTEMBER 2018

Sat 1 – FRR is currently active mainly in Asian countries such as: India, Pakistan, Indonesia and Nepal. Pray that the Lord will enable them to equip teams for other disaster prone areas.

FEBC Chinese Ministry

Sun 2 – WEEKLY SUMMARY: Over the past year FEBC's Chinese Ministry received 6,159 listener responses, 40 million program downloads, 44,000 hours of media streaming, 75,000 WeChat downloads and 755 enrolments into the 'Liangyou Theological Seminary'. It is truly a blessed time for FEBC's ministry in China and we give all the glory to God for His amazing work. Pray that the Lord will continue to bless their broadcasts so that listeners will grow in the truth!

Mon 3 – The new regulations on religious affairs restricting the activity of 'unregistered' churches was officially implemented on the 1st of February 2018. This is causing a lot of tension for many. Pray that the Lord will give

strength and courage to all those affected.

Tue 4 – Brother Li, from Hebei Province is a second generation Christian who felt led to enrol in the 'Liangyou Theological Seminary' after listening to FEBC's broadcasts. He now equips people for ministry. Pray that he will be used mightily by God!

Wed 5 – Brother Zhang from China is a member of an unregistered church and says that they do not meet in the same building more than once. Pray that the Lord will prepare safe meeting places for his church so that their desire to worship will not be interrupted.

Wed 12 – FEBC engages in uplifting community work and outreaches across the country to demonstrate the love of Jesus. Pray that the Lord will provide all the resources needed.

Thu 13 – “I am very grateful to God, because FEBC’s broadcasts offer me consolation and strength, especially when I feel lonely. The

radio team visited me.” Thank the Lord for using FEBC to speak to listeners’ hearts.

Fri 14 – The team at Heartline Radio often arrange trips to visit their listeners across the country. These trips usually go on for several days. Pray for the strength and endurance of the team members who dedicate their lives

to meet their listeners’ needs.

Sat 15 – Please pray for all the broadcasters to be led by the Spirit, while they create their programs. May every word spoken be a blessing to their listeners.

FEBC Russian Ministries

Sun 16 – WEEKLY SUMMARY: FEBC Russian Ministries broadcasts the Good News in Russia, the Ukraine and Central Asia with the use of new media tools, such as social networks, smart phone applications and internet broadcasting. Each month they reach millions of listeners with the Good News of the gospel and receive more than 25,000 listener responses. FEBC’s key audience in Russia is the non-church going, nominal Orthodox Christians, sceptics and atheists. Their mission is to inspire people to follow Jesus Christ. Most people in Russia see God as either an all-‘forgiving grandpa’ or a ‘harsh judge’. Pray that through FEBC’s broadcasts the people of Russia will come to know God as a loving and Holy Father.

Mon 17 – “Before I started listening to your programs I didn’t know much about God. My understanding of Him was a God of justice that brings punishment. But now, I see God as a comforter who came to carry our burdens.” Thank the Lord for revealing Himself through FEBC’s broadcasts.

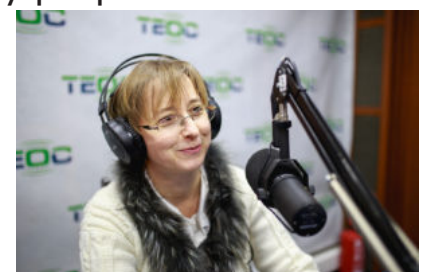
Tue 18 – FEBC broadcasts in several cities in the Ukraine bordering rebel regions, bringing hope to the people whose lives have been devastated by the ongoing war. Pray that God will protect the broadcasters who also live in the same areas and are experiencing difficulties.

Wed 19 – “Dozens of my friends and relatives left town. Two were wounded and another one was killed six months ago. It is a miracle that we can hear these powerful lessons from the Bible, in a town that is devastated by war,” says a listener from the Ukraine. Pray for the protection of these people.

Thu 20 – “Apparently Christianity is not as remote or as backward as I thought! Just the opposite is true: Christianity is about my everyday life, and how I should respond to God.” Thank the Lord for bringing clarity to listeners and transforming their hearts.

Fri 21 – Give thanks to God for the many listeners expressing their new found passion for Christ and their desire to serve Him. “As we are going through this cruel war and dealing with corruption, I know that I want to do something real, something that God would approve of.”

Sat 22 – This year, FEBC will continue to intensify broadcasts aimed at popularising Bible study as many people in Russia do not read their Bibles. Pray for this endeavour.



FEBC Kyrgyzstan



Sun 23 – WEEKLY SUMMARY: The FEBC team in Kyrgyzstan are determined to accomplish their goal to establish as many stations as is required to reach the entire population. So far, there are four active stations. The latest one is situated in the city of Talas. In addition, there are plans being made for a 5th station in one of two cities where FEBC is currently not heard on air. Together with their partners they hope to provide, through their broadcasts, practical solutions to social issues, by focusing on rebuilding the family unit. Pray with us for FEBC's plans to reach the entire population of Kyrgyzstan with the Good News.

Mon 24 – Rudi Wiens, the Director of FEBC Germany and Central Asia, oversees the radio ministry in Kyrgyzstan and all their projects. Pray that the Lord will guide him and give him wisdom for his work.

Tue 25 – Talas is spiritually one of the dark-

est places in Kyrgyzstan. Historically, this is where Shamanism and Islam were first interwoven. Many people here still worship the spirits of the deceased. Pray that the Lord will open their hearts to accept Jesus Christ.

Wed 26 – The new station in Talas aims to create programs that teach godly family values and addresses topics like God's peace and salvation. Pray that the Lord will inspire the producers to create truthful and heartfelt broadcasts.

Thu 27 – This culturally Muslim nation has been so accepting of the Gospel message. The team receives regular feedback from listeners about how their lives have changed. Pray that the Lord will reveal himself to those who have not yet heard the Good News.

Fri 28 – "Let our ministry in 2018 have more success and more influence in this world. May more people hear the gospel of Jesus Christ," says program-director Ulanbek. Pray that the Lord will increase their reach in Kyrgyzstan.

Sat 29 – Please pray for Janysh, FEBC's station manager in Kyrgyzstan, and for all his staff. Pray that through their work many Muslims will accept Jesus Christ, even though this is a challenge in a Muslim country. Nothing is impossible with God!

FEBC Kazakhstan

Sun 30 – WEEKLY SUMMARY: Kazakhstan, a former Soviet republic, is home to one of the most ethnically diverse populations in the world. According to a census conducted in 2016, there are two dominant ethnic

groups in the country: ethnic Kazakhs, which make up 66.48% of the population, and ethnic Russians, which account for 20.61% of the population. There are also a wide array of other minority groups represented: Ukrai-

nians, Uzbeks, Germans, Tatars, Uyghurs, Koreans and Meskhetian Turks. By tradition Kazakhs are Sunni Muslims, whereas the Slavic people are traditionally Orthodox Christians. Based on the feedback we receive from FEBC, their listeners are open to the gospel and many are seeking for meaning that only Jesus Christ can give. Please pray with us for the lost people of Kazakhstan, FEBC's staff and all of their listeners.

OCTOBER 2018

Mon 1 – Recently the office and studio had a few unpleasant security issues. Please pray that the Lord will give Nurlan and his staff the wisdom to make the right decisions regarding these matters.

Tue 2 – Please pray for Ruslan, FEBC's station manager from Kazakhstan, who is working together with Ulanbek from Kyrgyzstan, to create a strategic plan for the ministry in those countries.

Wed 3 – "I am a single mother of two children and have never been married. Your broadcasts taught me that bad habits can

lead to serious mistakes. I also heard about Jesus and His forgiveness. It changed my life. I feel forgiven and have accepted Jesus." Pray that the Lord will guide this listener in her new found faith.

Thu 4 – "In your broadcast you spoke about the importance of praying for the government. Too often we simply make fun of them, while they need our prayers. You have encouraged me to pray for our government and sincerely and more often." Thank the Lord for providing intercessors.

Fri 5 – Pray for the listeners, like this one from Almaty who responded in agreement to a message from one of FEBC's broadcasts, "By being a good example, our children will follow our example. Thus it is very important what and how we pass on to them. May God help us to do what is right."

Sat 6 – The staff in Kazakhstan are active in their efforts in caring for the neediest in the community. They regularly reach out to families. Pray that the Lord will provide the resources to expand their work in this community.

FEBA Pakistan

Mon 8 – FEBA recently developed a radio audio-story program, called "Today's story", in order to better engage with listeners. The response is growing and listeners are taking an interest in the broadcasts. Pray that listeners will be motivated through FEBA's broadcasts to pursue Christ.

Tue 9 – A listener's response to the audio-story program; "I like the style of the

story teller. Thank you FEBA for bringing such an important issue of peace and justice in a very polite way. Please keep up this good work." Pray that the Lord's blessing will be upon every listener.

Wed 10 – In addition to the new audio storytelling initiative, FEBA Pakistan is launching a video production project that will visually portray the audio stories. Pray for the success of this project.

Thu 11 – "I listen to your broadcasts almost every day. The new program, "Light of Truth", is great. I have quit smoking after listening to these programs. My wife and I also enjoy the "Thought of the day" where you share

wisdom from the Holy Bible." Praise the Lord for enabling FEBA Pakistan to broadcast life-changing messages.

The listener clubs also continue to grow regardless of the many challenges they face. Recently our National Director, Dr Jurie Vermeulen, and Rev. Amos Siyabu Phiri, Director of FEBA Malawi, travelled to Macomia in Mozambique to host another seminar on innovative programming. Pray that the Lord will bless this ministry in Malawi as they continue to raise a generation of faithful followers of Christ.

Mon 15 – Malawi is currently experiencing a dry spell, which causes army worms to infest the fields and eat all the crops. For most, farming is their livelihood. Please pray that the Lord will send rain and protect all those affected by the drought.

Tue 16 – Rev. Amos Siyabu Phiri recently visited listeners in the town of Mpagaja in Balaka, where he got a chance to speak to the members of the clubs where 27 people gave their lives to Jesus, as their Lord and Saviour. Praise the Lord for reaping a harvest of souls!

Wed 17 – "This dry spell is the best lesson for us, since many of us don't want to listen to God – this has been a wake-up call for us to listen to God's Word." Pray that the Lord will reward their renewed obedience.

Thu 18 – "I used to be a Muslim and lived a life that was not pleasing to God. I have learnt so much through your programs and have now found the true living God. Even my friends can testify that this station broadcasts the truth." Pray that the Lord will raise them up.

Fri 19 – "My life was full of uncertainty until I started listening to your programs. Now I know Jesus is the truth and I have no doubt
