

Tuesday 24 September: "I did not thank God for all the hardships in my life - but I thank God that through all these hardships, I have learned to trust and rely heavily on Him alone. May God bless you all with love in Christ Jesus!" (FEBA Bible Correspondence Course student in a Thai prison)

Wednesday 25 September: "Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus" (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 NIV)

Thursday 26 September: FEBA broadcasts to several ethnic minorities, including the Akha people who live in the mountains of Laos, Thailand, Myanmar and China. Their religion is animistic, with ancestral worship playing a central role. Pray for the FEBA Akha Radio team as they prepare new content, and pray that listeners will embrace the Good News.

Friday 27 September: Praise God for the opportunity to broadcast the Good News via shortwave radio! Despite the popularity of internet and smartphone platforms, these remain inaccessible to many people in remote places or closed countries, but short-wave radio can still reach them. Pray that every FEBA shortwave broadcast will be heard by those who need it most.

Saturday & Sunday 28-29 September: There are approximately 400 unreached people groups in China. FEBA's Liangyou Theological Seminary trains pastors to share the Good News with people in a challenging environment. Despite numerous obstacles, FEBA China's programs are still downloaded by millions of listeners and God's Word is still transforming lives. Pray for FEBA China to remain strong in their faith as they navigate the challenges of evangelising in China and pray for the teachers and students of Liangyou Theological Seminary to persevere in their studies and their ministry.

Monday 30 September: Many ethnic minorities do not yet have access to the gospel in their heart language. FEBA believes in empowering native speakers to share God's Word with their own people. Today, we broadcast in 152 languages and the number keeps growing! Pray for the skills and opportunities needed to reach more listeners in their heart language.



Prayer Focus

September 2024

"Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus"
1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 NIV

Monday 2 September: Pray for the people of Yemen, where the violent conflict is causing food shortages and disrupting essential services. FEBA Yemen broadcasts 60-minute shortwave programs daily, and the station receives 3,000 responses per month! Pray for God to renew the faith and strength of FEBA Yemen and its listeners every day.

Tuesday 3 September: "I became bankrupt ten years ago and my friends deserted me. One day, while driving, I listened to FEBC. At that moment, I started to cry and couldn't stop. I clearly felt God's compassion and calling. He showed me grace and love. After that, I decided to accept the Lord. To this day I'm still following Him." (FEBA listener in Central Asia)

Wednesday 4 September: "You will show me the path of life; in Your presence is fullness of joy; at Your right hand are pleasures forevermore." (Psalm 16:11 NKJV)

Thursday 5 September: The Siddhi, or Sheedi, are an ethnic minority group of African descent found in India and Pakistan. They are among the most marginalised communities and in Indian society, they are seen as equal to the "untouchables" or Dalits. Pray for FEBA's broadcasts to reach the Siddhi people with the Good News of God's grace.

Friday 6 September: Pray for FEBA leaders all over the world. Each country presents its own challenges, from persecution to poverty, and it is up to the leaders to guide their teams on the right path as they bring Christ to the world through media. Pray for God to make His strength and wisdom known to FEBA's leaders.

Saturday & Sunday 7-8 September: Many people don't realise what a privilege it is to be literate. More than 750 million adults worldwide are illiterate, which limits their access to information, skills, and adequate income. These people are also unable to read the Bible or any Christian literature that might lead them to Christ. Thank God for radio, which allows FEBA to reach illiterate people with the Good News every day! Pray also that He will enable FEBA to keep broadcasting across the world, until all have heard.

Monday 9 September: Pray for those who suffer from addiction. Many of them fall into the trap of addiction while they are looking for something to fill a need inside of them. Pray that they will discover the true Source of fulfilment through FEBA's broadcasts, and that He will heal their pain.

Tuesday 10 September: "I went to a Christian rehab centre. It saved my life! I became a Christian there, and that's where I started listening to FEBA's programs. You helped me so much. Thank you!" (FEBA Russia listener)

Wednesday 11 September: "Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective." (James 5:16 NIV)

Thursday 12 September: The Tatar people group is the largest ethnic minority in the Russian Federation, with a population exceeding 5 million. Most Tatars in Russia practise Islam and less than 1% are Evangelical Christians. Pray that Tatar Muslims will open their hearts to the gospel, and that God will bless FEBA Russia's efforts to reach them.

Friday 13 September: Pray for the 4.8 million people in the Philippines who were affected by Super Typhoon Carina at the end of July. FEBA Philippines' staff and their families were unharmed, but some of their homes sustained damage. Praise God for His protection and pray for His provision as people work to restore their homes.

Saturday & Sunday 14-15 September: The Horn of Africa – which consists of Ethiopia, Somalia, Eritrea and Djibouti – poses a great challenge to evangelists. Ethiopia is among the top 50 countries on Open Doors' World Watch List of the most difficult places to be a Christian, while Somalia and Eritrea rank among the top five! FEBA Ethiopia's broadcasts reach across the region and as far as Lebanon, where listeners have come to Christ. Pray

for the FEBA Ethiopia team to have the courage to proclaim God's Word boldly and the wisdom to do so effectively.

Monday 16 September: FEBA Malawi's station, Litala FM, is growing so fast that they need more staff! Despite the many economic obstacles, the team works tirelessly to share God's Word with the Yao Muslims in Malawi and Tanzania. Pray that God will send skilled, passionate workers to become part of the FEBA Malawi team.

Tuesday 17 September: "When I realised that Jesus is God, and He loves me no matter how many mistakes I've made, it was like I began breathing again. My neighbours are telling me that I am like a new person!" (FEBA Kyrgyzstan listener)

Wednesday 18 September: "... God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." (Romans 5:8 NIV)

Thursday 19 September: The Rohingya people are considered the most persecuted ethnic minority in the world. Although they live in Myanmar, they are technically stateless. Most Rohingyas are Muslim, and they are frequently the targets of violent attack. Pray for the Rohingyas to open their hearts to FEBA Myanmar's efforts, so that they can find a home in Christ.

Friday 20 September: Pray for the team at FEBA Mozambique's station in Cabo Delgado, who must contend with the violent jihadist insurgency. Pray also for the health and strength of the entire FEBA Mozambique team, as they work to open their seventh station and continue to proclaim God's Word throughout the country, especially in places where witchcraft is on the rise.

Saturday & Sunday 21-22 September: 21 September is the UN International Day of Peace, which remains a rare commodity in many places where FEBA works. Soldiers on the front lines, civilians whose lives are coloured by violent conflict, and refugees from war-torn countries have received comfort and hope from the Good News that FEBA broadcasts. Pray for an end to the war between Russia and Ukraine, the jihadist insurgency in Mali and Mozambique, and the turmoil in Myanmar and Yemen. Pray also for all the FEBA staff and listeners who must face war every day while yearning for peace.

Monday 23 September: Today is the International Day of Sign Languages. Did you know FEBA Vietnam collaborates with the Vietnam Deaf Bible Society to create video sign language translations for FEBA's videos? Praise God for this opportunity, and pray that He will reach His Deaf children through FEBA's video broadcasts all over the world.
