

MONTHLY E-PRAYER FOCUS



NOVEMBER 2025

Saturday & Sunday 1-2 November: November is Global Bible Month. Staying close to God's Word is fundamental to FEBA's ministry. Every FEBA team creates extensive content to introduce listeners to the Bible and help them to understand it. From Bible studies on Zoom in the mountains of Southeast Asia to Bible programs in Malawi, FEBA opens God's Word for believers and non-believers alike. Pray that every Bible teacher in FEBA will remain faithful to God's Word and that every Bible program will sow a seed that bears fruit in listeners' hearts.

Monday 3 November: FEBA's teams in Ukraine, Russia, and Moldova produce programs to teach small children about Jesus and the Bible. Now, many parents are also becoming interested in the gospel because of these programs. Pray that God will grant His grace to every young listener and their parents as they hear the gospel through FEBA's broadcasts.

Tuesday 4 November: Praise God for letting listeners like Marina meet Him through FEBA Moldova's Bible program. "As I heard about what it meant to find my identity in Jesus, I felt like I had worth for the first time. And I didn't have to find it in the praise of others – I found it in God!"

Wednesday 5 November: "Incline my heart to your testimonies, and not to selfish gain! Turn my eyes from looking at worthless things; and give me life in your ways" (Psalm 119:36-37 ESV). Pray that FEBA's staff and listeners will always keep their eyes on God and live according to His will.

Thursday 6 November: FEBA Kyrgyzstan's Bible program is drawing a lot of negative reactions from Muslim listeners, who leave comments that occasionally turn aggressive. However, by the grace of God some of these lead into sincere conversations about Jesus Christ. Pray for God's wisdom as FEBA Kyrgyzstan's team engages with hostile listeners and ask that those listeners will be saved.

Friday 7 November: There is a growing response to FEBA Russia's Bible program as people yearn for light in a darkening world. Pray for the young men who are being conscripted and sent to war against their will, and for the families who stay behind. Ask that they and other listeners will find the Light in God's Word.

Saturday & Sunday 8-9 November: Indonesia has the largest Muslim population in a single country, and many do not know that Christian radio exists. Now, FEBA Indonesia has launched its Outside Broadcasting (OB) van ministry, which is taking the gospel to the city streets and rural areas. The OB van team conducts street interviews, engages with people who are not listeners yet, and does live broadcasts of events like Christian concerts or festivals. Pray for the FEBA Indonesia team as they embrace this new challenge, and ask God for a great harvest.

Monday 10 November: FEBA Cambodia works closely with the Cambodia Community Bible Institute to bring Bible teaching to places that have no church. FEBA provides books and audio lessons, while affiliated pastors travel to villages to host Bible study groups with students. Pray that CCBI students will experience the power of God's living Word.

Tuesday 11 November: Praise God for this Cambodia Community Bible Institute student, who recently shared, "Through the CCBI program, I have studied God's Word and listened to the audio teachings as if I were attending a real Bible school. It has transformed my spiritual life, helping me understand Scripture more deeply and experience God's love in a new way."

Wednesday 12 November: "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God" (Colossians 3:16 ESV). Pray that FEBA's Bible programs will open God's Word to listeners so that they can find wisdom and delight in it.

Thursday 13 November: The Philippines have already weathered several severe storms this season. FEBA Philippines lends support through its First Response Radio, which sets up a temporary radio station in disaster-stricken areas and broadcasts vital information and messages of encouragement to the public. Pray for God's protection over the FRR teams and ask that their broadcasts will draw listeners to Christ.

Friday 14 November: FEBA Indonesia's ASIK! (which translates to "I love to follow Christ!") program equips young people to serve as missionaries on social media. More than 70% of the population uses social media, making it a great platform for reaching the unreached. Pray that the ASIK! program will inspire young Indonesians to share the gospel with their peers.

Saturday & Sunday 15-16 November: A violent storm recently damaged FEBA Mali's station, forcing them to stop broadcasting for several days. The director shared the following: "We had the engineer and his assistant come from Bamako, despite extremely difficult conditions ... the two men cleaned and repaired everything, replacing whatever needed to be replaced. They also painted the tower. We are now back on air and our listeners are very, very happy." Praise God for His blessing on FEBA Mali and His provision that keeps them on air.

Monday 17 November: Even though FEBA Sudan has only been on air for a short while, they have already started receiving encouraging feedback from listeners. One listener records every program to listen to it again before going to sleep! Pray that God will work through FEBA Sudan to guide lost souls to Him.

Tuesday 18 November: "I was a Muslim and I used to pray like them, but since I started listening to RACE FM, I converted to Christianity, thanks to the pastor's preaching in Gabri, my mother tongue." Praise God for every listener in Chad who can now hear the gospel in their own language through FEBA Chad's broadcasts.

Wednesday 19 November: "Oh, how abundant is your goodness, which you have stored up for those who fear you and worked for those who take refuge in you, in the sight of the children of mankind!" (Psalm 31:19 ESV). Pray that more people will discover God's goodness through FEBA's ministry.

Thursday 20 November: Please pray for the believers in northern Mozambique. At the beginning of October, the violence escalated and claimed the lives of dozens of Christians, including some in the village where FEBA's radio station is situated. Pray that FEBA's staff and listeners will remain strong in faith, and that the peace of God will guard their hearts in Christ.

Friday 21 November: Pray for FEBA's ministry to the Yao in Malawi, where thousands of Muslims are joining listener clubs to learn more about Christ. Pastor Amos Phiri and his team travel widely to carry out the Great Commission. Pray that God will give them protection and wisdom as they lead others to Christ and support persecuted believers.

Saturday & Sunday 22-23 November: It is estimated that between 50,000 and 70,000 Christians are held in prison camps in North Korea. The country is first on Open Doors' World Watch List of the worst places to be a Christian, yet the underground church remains strong. FEBA Korea broadcasts the Good News to North Korea for 18 hours a day, with programs being produced and presented by North Korean defectors. Pray that the church in North Korea will flourish and that FEBA Korea's broadcasts will help listeners to persevere in faith.

Monday 24 November: FEBA Korea has a huge ministry, with 13 FM stations broadcasting all over the country, as well as AM stations broadcasting to North Korea, China, and Japan. Pray for Director Daniel Han and his team as they shine the light of the gospel for those trapped in darkness.

Tuesday 25 November: At a dark time in her life, Ms K. discovered the Bible through FEBA Japan. "I bought one and started reading it regularly. The more I read, the more I felt like I was being led out of darkness into light, and both my heart and body began to heal." Pray that FEBA will inspire more people to read God's Word.

Wednesday 26 November: "Then they cried to the Lord in their trouble, and he delivered them from their distress. He sent out his word and healed them, and delivered them from their destruction" (Psalm 107:19-20 ESV). Pray that FEBA's listeners will seek help from God in times of trouble, instead of turning to worldly things.

Thursday 27 November: All over the world, Generation Z are opening their hearts to the Good News, including in Japan. While the older generation remains hard to reach, the younger generation is curious about the gospel, and FEBA Japan is looking to seize the opportunity. Pray for God's guidance as they develop programs to share His Word with Gen Z in Japan.

Friday 28 November: In some countries, like Hong Kong and Taiwan, the roots of false religions run so deep that people are reluctant to respond to the gospel. Despite sparse feedback, FEBA's teams continue persevering in faith to broadcast God's Word. Pray that God will bless the efforts of FEBA Taiwan and FEBA Hong Kong with abundant fruit.

Saturday & Sunday 29-30 November: Did you know? More than 3 billion people have never heard the gospel even once. FEBA has been broadcasting the Good News via radio for 79 years, reaching millions of listeners, and social media has opened doors for evangelism where FEBA could not get a broadcasting licence. Pray that God will give FEBA's teams the wisdom, strength, and creativity to bring the gospel to the unreached by all available means. Ask Him to prepare people's hearts for His Word, so that the seed sown by FEBA will bear lasting fruit.
